### Mission

To promote delivery of quality social and behavioral healthcare services for children and their families living in the Greater St. Louis Metropolitan area through advocacy, collaboration and communication.

### History

- Founded by five collaborating nonprofits in 2006.
- Grown to **60 agencies** with successful histories of serving the behavioral health needs of children and their families.
- Meets monthly to advance our critically important mission.

### 2019 Community Impact

- **CSC agencies served 292,730 children in 2019**
- Services provided by CSC agencies include:
  - ✓ Basic needs, behavior management, case management, child abuse prevention & treatment, crisis intervention, educational and preventive behavioral healthcare, foster and adoptive services, housing, respite services, substance abuse prevention & treatment, suicide prevention, support groups, support & guidance for parents, therapy, and transitional living

  - ✓ CSC agencies are committed to serving those who need their help, regardless of their insurance coverage or ability to pay.
- 7,431 dedicated staff empowered these agencies.
- 1,524 board members provide guidance, resources, and credibility in the community.
- CSC collaborates with Behavioral Health Network of Greater St. Louis, which utilizes CSC members' expertise to guide the work required for key strategic initiatives and inform on issues and opportunities affecting children, youth and families in the region.
